- We have started to think about E.SAFETY rules for school.



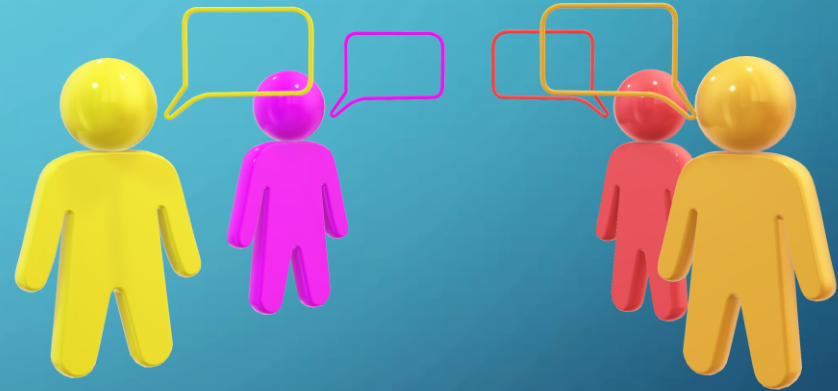

The Pop-Up Gremlins

REMEMBER: **STOP , CLOSE , TELL**



Stop

It can be very annoying to have a pop-up appear in the middle of your screen. It might stop you playing your game or watching your video.



You may be tempted to tap on the pop-up to get rid of it.

Stop!

Don't click on things that pop up on the screen. You never know what gremlins may appear. Some pop-ups can make your device stop working properly.



Close

If you are using a device with a lid then you should **close** the lid.



If the device doesn't have a lid then put it down in a safe place.
This will stop you touching anything on the screen.

Tell

Don't try to solve the problem on your own. The best thing to do is to **tell** a trusted adult about what is happening.

Talk About It: Who could you **tell** if you saw a pop-up on your device?

The adult will be able to get rid of the pop-up and check that your device is safe to use.



Remember

The Internet is a shared space and sometimes, when you are online, you may see things that worry or upset you. Messages or pictures can appear on your device. If this happens you just need to remember to follow these three safety rules.
