What is Cyber Bullying?

- Cyber bullying is any act of online bullying that has happened more than once on a physical device or somewhere online. It different to 'bullying' because it does not take place face to face.
- An example of cyber bullying is when someone calls people names and is just being very mean to people on purpose.
- It takes place over digital devices like cell phones, computers and tablets.

- It can happen anywhere online such as in messages, social media or gaming platforms.
- Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false or mean content about someone else. Basically any form of online communication.

How to Stop a Cyber-Bully!

- **Never** reply to their messages.
- Tell a trusted adult what is happening so that they can help you.
- Take a screenshot as evidence.
- Only answer a call if you know the person who is ringing you.
- Remember that it is not your fault.



Don't Be a Bystander

A bystander is someone who watches something happening but does nothing to help. **When cyber bullying happens there are often many bystanders who take no notice.** They think it is none of their business or can't be bothered to try and stop it. When bystanders spread a cyber bully's nasty messages they become bullies too. Instead, offering support to a person that is being bullied or reporting the bully can make a huge difference.

Remember

- When you send something online you can't 'take it back' or make it disappear.
- Everything you do online leaves a digital footprint.
- When something is shared it is shared FOREVER!
